

THE MU'MIN LIVES THE Shahadah

Laa Ilaaha Illa Allah

O my Brothers and Sisters in Iman, our lives begin in the Name of Allah, as the Adhan is sounded in our ears; and is hoped to end in His Name with "La Ilaaha Illa Allah" as our last words. And when we have borne witness that Allah is our *Rabb*, then we direct our lives upon His commandments.

Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala Says,

"Verily, those who say: "Our Lord is Allah," and thereafter stand firm, on them shall be no fear, nor shall they grieve." [46:13]

Imam At-Tabari narrated that Abu Bakr As-Siddiq (May Allah be pleased with him) said, "They are those who did not associate anything with Allah in worship." And how "beautiful" are the glad tidings for such a believer, as Allah Says:

"Verily, those who say: 'Our Lord is Allah,' and then they stand firm, on them the angels will descend (at the time of their death) (saying): 'Fear not, nor grieve! But receive the glad tidings of Paradise which you have been promised!" [41:30]

And in the following verses,

"We have been your friends in the life of this world and are (so) in the Hereafter. Therein you shall have (all) that your inner-selves desire, and therein you shall have (all) for which you ask. An entertainment from (Allah), the Oft-Forgiving, Most Merciful." [41:31-32]

Imam Ibn Kathir said in his Tafsir (commentary) while commenting on these verses,

"The angels will descend on them at the time of death assuring them that they should not fear as regards what they will face in the Hereafter nor grieve over what they are leaving behind in this world like their children, family, property or debt, for Allah will take care of all that. The angels will also give them glad tiding of the Paradise which they have been promised. They will also tell them: 'We have been your friends and companions in the life of the world guiding you to the right path with the command of Allah. We will also be your friends in the Hereafter, keeping your company in the graves. We will relieve your fears on the Day of Resurrection, help you pass the bridge and take you to Paradise.' The angels will also tell them, You shall have all that you desire in Jannah and all that you request for shall be provided for you. All this is an entertainment and favour from Allah, for it is He Who forgives your sins and have mercy on you."

And how Great is the reward that lies in wait for the believer?

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said, "Musa (Upon him be peace) asked his Rabb: 'Who amongst the inhabitants of Jannah will be the lowest in rank?' He said: 'It will be a person who will be admitted into Jannah last of all when all the dwellers of Jannah have entered Jannah.' It will be said to him: 'Enter Jannah.' But he will say: 'O my Rabb! How should I enter while the people have settled in their apartments and taken their shares?' It will be said to him:

'Will you be satisfied and pleased if you have a kingdom like that of a monarch of the world?' He will say: 'I will be content, my Rabb.' Allah will say:

'For you is that, and like that, and like that, and like that.' He will say at the fifth time: 'I am well-pleased, my Rabb'. Allah will say:

It is for you and ten times more like it. You will have whatever your soul desires and whatever your eyes could delight in. He will say: I am well-pleased, my Rabb."2

So that my believers, is the rank of the least one in Jannah. And whenever you find Jannah mentioned in this book, you may wish to recall this hadith of the least, for that would help you realize Allah's favors upon you even more.

But not equal are those who transgress and disbelieve thereby shaytan, the outcast. And they recompensed for their evil in Hell, whose fire never dies down at all – one that is eternal.

Allah 'Azza wa Jall Says,

"They will long to get out of the Fire, but never will they get out therefrom, and theirs will be a lasting torment." [5: 37]

And the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"Your fire (in the world) is one part from seventy parts of the fire of Hell." For which the Sahabah replied, O Messenger of Allah, even this would have been enough!"3

But be cheerful O believers, for Allah's Mercy is limitless. Those in whose hearts is Iman, will certainly be taken out from Hell, as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) has said:

"Allah will say (on the Day of Resurrection): 'By My Honour, and By My Majesty, and By My Greatness, and By My Sublimity; whoever has said Laa Ilaha illa Allah, I will certainly take him out of the (hell) fire."⁴

Muhammad Rasulullah

Could we even enlist the favors that our beloved Prophet (Peace be upon him) has done unto us? This Shahadah has reached us upon our Prophet's (Peace be upon him) untiring efforts in the face of fear and adversity.

Munib Al-Azdi (May Allah be pleased with him) narrates:5 "In the days of my ignorance i.e. before I accepted Islam, I saw the Messenger of Allah, who would say:

"O My people, say 'Laa Ilaaha Illa Allah' and be successful."

Some of them spat at his face, and someone threw dust at him and some abused him till mid-day. Then a girl brought a bowl of water with which he washed his face and hands, and said, "O my little daughter! Do not fear your father's sudden murder or disgrace." This girl was Zainab, the daughter of the Prophet (Peace be upon him).

Yet, the Prophet (Peace be upon him) was always concerned for You - his Ummah. 'Ummul Mu'mineen 'Aisha (May Allah be pleased with her) said that once I saw the Prophet (Peace be upon him) quite delighted. I said: O Messenger of Allah, supplicate to Allah for me. He supplicated: "O Allah, forgive 'Aisha, all her past sins and future sins, and her secret sins and her open sins."

Hearing this 'Aisha laughed so much that her head touched her lap. (Thereupon) the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said: "Are you very happy with my 'Dua? She replied: Why should I not be happy with your 'Dua for me? He said:

"I swear by Allah! This is my Du'a for my Ummah in every Salat."6

And on the frightful Youmal Qiyamah, or the Day of Resurrection, the sun shall be brought close to the creation until there is a mile between it and them, Mankind will sweat according to what they have done; the sweat reaching to the ankles of some, to the knees of others, to the waist of others, while some will have their mouths covered with sweat.⁷And on that day, mankind will be in confusion running from one Prophet to another (Upon them be peace), requesting them to intercede with Allah to help them. When they will finally reach the Prophet (Peace be upon him) who, with Allah's permission will oblige; what are the words that he says?

"O My Rabb, My Ummah! My Ummah!"8

This, O believers, was our Prophet (Peace be upon him), who suffered for us, wept before Allah in his Du'a for us, and who will, Inshallah intercede for us on Youmal Qiyamah.

'Aisha narrates9 that a man came to the Prophet (Peace be upon him), and said: "O Messenger of Allah! You are more beloved to me than myself, and more beloved to me than my wife and my wealth, and more beloved to me than my children. Indeed when I am in my house and I think of you, I lose my patience until I reach and see you. When I remember that you and I are going to die, I know that as you enter Jannah, you will be elevated along with the Prophets; and if I enter Jannah, I fear that I may not see you."

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) did not reply to him until Jibril descended with the revelation of this Aayah:

"And whoso obeys Allah and the Messenger (Muhammad), then they will be in the company of those on whom Allah has bestowed His Grace, of the Prophets, the Siddiqun, the Martyrs, and the Righteous. And how excellent these companions are!" [4: 69]"

And never forget the glad tidings which the Prophet (Peace be upon him) has given You, dear brother or Sister in Iman:

"Indeed, none shall enter Jannah except the Mu'minun (the believers)."¹⁰

THE MU'MIN REMEMBERS ALLAH

The Remembrance of Allah

"Therefore remember Me. I will remember you." [2:152]

1. REMEMBER ALLAH

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

« يَقُولُ اللَّهُ تَعَالَى: أَنَا عِنْدَ ظَنَّ عَبْدِي بِي، وَأَنَا مَعَهُ إِذَا ذَكَرِنِي، فَإِنْ ذَكَرِنِي فِي نَفْسِهِ ذَكُرْتُهُ فِي نَفْسِى، وَإِنْ ذَكَرِنِي فِي مَلَإٍ ذَكَرْتُهُ فِي مَلَإٍ خَيْرٌ مِنْهُمْ، وَإِنْ تَقَرَّبَ إِلَيَّ بِشِبْرٍ ، تَقَرَّبْتُ إِلَيْهِ ذِرَاعًا، وَإِنْ تَقَرَّبَ إِلَىَّ ذِرَاعًا ، تَقَرَّبْتُ إِلَيْهِ بَاعًا ، وَإِنْ أَتَابِي يَمْشِي، أَتَيْتُهُ هَرُولَةً »

Allah the Most High says: 'I am just as My slave thinks I am. I am with him when he remembers Me. If he remembers Me in himself, I remember him in Myself; and if he remembers me in a gathering, I remember him in a better gathering (of the angels). If he comes closer to Me by a span¹¹, I go closer to him an arm's length; if he comes towards Me an arm's length, I go towards him two-arm's length; and if he comes to me walking, I run unto him."12

Dear brother or sister in Iman, see with what great love and mercy Allah turns towards us when we remember him. And isn't it only befitting that "The Love of the beloved must be unconditionally returned", as Imam Ibn Qayyim Al-Jawziyyah pens in the opening lines of his poem "Love of Allah."

2. THOSE ALIVE BEFORE ALLAH

Only those people who remember Allah, are considered alive before him as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"The similitude of the one who remembers his Rabb and the one who does not remember Him, is like that of the living and the dead."13

3. ENTER THE HIGHEST JANNAH EASILY

Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"There are many a people who remember Allah on their soft beds; and for this, they will enter the highest (of) Jannah."14

Let none of us, let go of this easy routine to please Allah before we sleep – thereby achieving the highest Jannah.

4. THE CAUSE OF YOUR SATISFACTION IN JANNAH

That the dhikr of Allah is the greatest, will be realized by the dwellers of Jannah, as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"The dwellers of Jannah will not regret over anything except the time spent by them (in their worldly lives), without the remembrance of Allah, the Possessor of Might and Glory."15

The Qur'an is the Mu'min's Companion

"And We have indeed made the Qur'an easy to understand and remember, then is there any one who will remember (or receive admonítíon?)" [54:17]

1. THE BEST

If Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala were to rank his slaves, then the people of Qur'aan are the best, for the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"The best amongst you is the one who learns the Qur'an and teaches

2. EVERY LETTER COUNTS

When even a single good deed could make a difference on Youmal Qiyamah, why let go of the rewards that comes from every letter of the Qur'an as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever recites a letter from the Book of Allah, he will be credited with a good deed, and a good deed gets a ten-fold reward. I do not say that Alif-Lam-Mim is one letter, but Alif is a letter, Lam is a letter and Mim is a letter" 17

3. THE SPECIAL PEOPLE OF ALLAH

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"The people of the Qur'an, they are the people of Allah and His Special ones."18

May Allah be praised! Could there be anything greater than Allah Himself regarding someone special, and what would be his reward?

4. IN THE COMPANY OF NOBLE ANGELS

When the people of this world take pride in their connections, the one proficient in the Qur'an will be with the Noble Angels. And the one who cannot read fluently, yet persists, will be better than them as the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"The one who is proficient in the recitation of the Qur'an will be with the honorable and obedient scribes 19 (angels) and he who recites the Qur'an and finds it difficult to recite, doing his best to recite it in the best way possible, will have a double reward"20

The mercy of Allah knows no bounds. This hadith serves as a reminder that even those who are not good enough hope to earn more with their efforts.

5. CLIMB THE LEVELS OF JANNAH

The more one remembers the correct recitation of the Qur'an, the higher will be his position in Jannah. The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"The one who was devoted to the Qur'an will be told on the Day of Resurrection: 'Recite and ascend (in ranks) as you used to recite when you were in the world. Your rank will be at the last Ayah you recite."21

Perhaps, the status of the lowest man in Jannah (see page 12) would help in realizing this hadith better. And doesn't it take just a few minutes to retain one Aayah from the Qur'an?

6. THE QUR'AN IS AN INTERCEDER

Abu Daud records that the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"There is a Surah in the Qur'an which contains thirty Ayat which kept interceding for a man until his sins are forgiven. This Surah is 'Blessed is He in Whose Hand is the dominion.' (Surah Mulk 67)."

Surah Al-Mulk's virtues, especially in defending from the punishment of the grave finds mention in many Ahaadith²². And the Prophet (Peace be upon him) would not sleep until he

had recited Surah Alif Laam Meem Sajdah (32) and Surah Al-Mulk $(67)^{23}$.

7. COMPLETE THE QUR'AN MANY TIMES OVER

Let's resolve to complete at least a third of the Qur'an easily everyday, for Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

"(Surah) Qul Huwallahu Ahad is equivalent to one-third of the Qur'an."24

8. BUILD AS MANY PALACES FOR YOURSELF

Muadh bin Anas Al-Juhani (May Allah be pleased) narrates that the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever recites Qul Huwallahu Ahad (Surah Ikhlaas) till he finishes it ten times, Allah will build for him a Palace in Jannah."25

Various descriptions have been given by the Prophet (Peace be upon him) about the palaces of Jannah. While the Ghurafaa²⁶ have been described to be transparent; the pavilions made from a single hollowed-out pearl are sixty miles high,²⁷ according to some reports, they are sixty miles wide. Allah's mercy is truly boundless! Could anyone turn away from such great bounties whose completion only takes a few minutes?

Why is my Dad proud that his Son is a Hafiz?

Read Master Nashwan Hameed's (Hifz 5th grade) 1st Place Winning speech delivered at Igra Arabic School's Annual Elocution Competition 1433H

A lot of people often ask my parents, what class is your son in...what class... is your son in?

But I want to tell all the people gathered here, that it is of course a great blessing and favor that Allah 'Azza wa Jall has bestowed on my parents and me, that my father tells them that "My Son is being a Hafiz first, and then he tells that I am in my fifth standard at Iqra School."

So why is my father feeling proud that I am being a *Hafiz*? After all I could choose to be a part of the so-called secular schools, and like I've heard some of the folks outside say, I could become c-o-o-l around my hip friends circle, yeah my "hip" friends circle?

Yeah, so why am I proud like my Dad to say that I am being *Hafiz*? I'll tell you why.

Very soon the Day of Judgment is to occur, my people. And once the time of our passing has arrived, and then there is no second chance. I, You, and everyone, will then witness what Allah 'Azza wa Jall says in the Qur'an:

"O Mankind! Fear your Lord and be dutiful to Him! Verily the Earthquake of the Hour that is of Judgment is a terrible thing." [22:1]

"The Day you shall see it, every nursing mother will forget her nursing, and every pregnant one will drop her load, and you shall see mankind as in drunken state, yet they will not be drunken but severe will be the torment of Allah." [22:2]

I may be too young to fully understand the gravity behind this verse, but at least what I know is nothing is dearer to a mother..."NOTHING!"... than the baby that she is carrying for months... So just imagine how severe the time would be for-her-to-drop-her-load? Subhanallah!

And then we will be held accountable for everything and we can't escape it!'

We can't escape it by saying that I was busy calculating the profit margin of my business...or by asking Allah to send us back - NO!

At that time Insha Allah, My parents will be made to wear a crown, whose light will be better than the light of the sun...and it's not just that but Rasulullah (Peace be upon him) said, "If the Sun were to

rise in your houses." This hadith has been narrated by Abu Dawud, Ahmad and Hakim. Rasulullah (Peace be upon him) then said, "What do you think about the person who himself acts upon it?" Subhanallah!

And that's not all, a *Hafiz* will be able to intercede for Ten²⁸ such members of his family and save them from the fire of hell...not one, two, three or five but ten. Subhanallah!

May be there are many here, who would want to be Hafiz listening to this...but are despaired owing to their time or age...But my Allah is Arhamur-Raahimeen dear people. He is Most Loving, so don't be sad my people. Even though you can't go ahead, but if you make any one a Hafiz from your time or money, then Inshallah, you too would get all the rewards that a Hafiz gets.²⁹ He could be any one, your son or daughter...or any student doing hifz whom you sponsor.

Every child in this world tries to get into a career by which he tries to make his parents proud and do justice to their investment. This is my way of doing them proud. That's why my Dad feels proud to say that he is the father of a son who is being a *Hafiz*!

And I pray to Allah that he gives me, You, and every one of us the tawfiq to do more good deeds that are pleasing to Him and accept them – Aameen.

The Adhkaar

"And the men and the women who remember Allah much with their hearts and tongues. Allah has prepared for them forgiveness and a great reward." [33:35]

1. THE MOST EXCELLENT DHIKR

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"The most excellent dhikr is: La ilaha ill Allah."30

The 'Ulama mention that Allah primarily sent His prophets for this kalimah. And since it forms the basis of His Deen that undoubtedly makes it, the best dhikr.

It is also narrated that when Musa (Upon him be peace) asked Allah to grant him words of remembrance that were meant exclusively for him - it was said: "Recite La ilaha ill Allah."31

2. THE DEAREST WORDS TO ALLAH

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"The dearest words to Allah are four: Subhan-Allah, Al-hamdu lillah, La ilaha ill Allah and Allahu Akbar."32

In another narration, it is stated that these are "the best words to Allah."33

3. THEY MEAN MORE THAN THE WORLD

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"That I say: "Subhan-Allah (Allah is free from imperfection), Alhamdu lillah (all praise is due to Allah), La ilaha ill Allah (there is None to be worshipped except Allah) and Allahu Akbar (Allah is the Greatest)', is dearer to me than anything over which the sun rises."34

That these words are dearer to the Prophet (Peace be upon him) than what the sun has risen upon i.e. the entire world, goes to show how invaluable they are with him.

4. THE *DHIKR* OF HOURS IN SECONDS!

Juwairiyah bint Al-Harith reported³⁵, the Mother of the Believers: The Prophet (Peace be upon him) came out of my apartment in the morning as I was busy in performing the dawn prayer. He came back in the forenoon and found me sitting there. The Prophet(Peace be upon him) said, "Are you still in the same position as I left you?" I replied in the affirmative.

Thereupon the Prophet(Peace be upon him) said:

"I recited four words three times after I had left you. If these are to be weighed against all you have recited since morning, these will be heavier. These are:

Subhan-Allahi wa bihamdihee, 'adada khalqihee, wa rida nafsihee, wa zinatah 'arshihee, wa midaada kalimatihi"³⁶

The dhikr of these words are highly rewarding. See how the recitation of a few moments equals hours of uninterrupted dhikr. This is Allah's great favor through which, we too can make up for dhikr that we have always wished to complete. Let none of us let go of a few seconds to complete them.

6. PLANT TREES IN JANNAH

When "the space that a whip takes to occupy in Jannah is better than the world and all that is in it,"37 how would it be, if beautiful orchards were waiting for you in Jannah, whose trees you can plant right here, as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"Say, Subhan-Allah, Al-hamdu lillah, La ilaha ill Allah and Allahu Akbar -for each one of these words a tree will be planted for you in Jannah."38

7. INCREASE YOUR TREASURES OF JANNAH

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said to Abu Musa, "Shall I not guide you to a treasure from the treasures of Jannah?" I said: "Yes, O Messenger of Allah!" Thereupon he (Peace be upon him) said (recite):

"La hawla wa la quwwata illa billah (There is no Power or Might except by Allah)"39

8. GET UNCOUNTABLE REWARDS!

Ubadah bin Samit (May Allah be pleased with him) narrates that the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"The one who asks forgiveness for Mu'min men and Mu'min women, Allah writes for him a virtue for every Mu'min man and Mu'min woman."40

Allahu Akbar! How easy is it to be credited with so many good deeds instantly. The following prayer of Prophet Ibrahim as occurs in the Qur'an is considered ideal for getting all the rewards as promised by this *hadith*:

"Our Lord! Forgive me and my parents, and (all) the believers on the Day when the reckoning will be established." [14:41]

The Adhkaar of Morning & Evening

BE THE BEST ON THE DAY OF RESURRECTION

Let no-one surpass you on the Day of Resurrection by following the words of Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) who said: "The one who recites in the morning and in the evening:

Subhan-Allahi wa bihamdihi (Allah is free from imperfection and I begin with praising Him) One hundred times, will not be excelled on the Day of Resurrection by anyone with better deeds than the one who utters the same words or utters more of these words."41

2. ALLAH WILL PLEASE YOU WITH THIS

The Messenger of Allah has said: "The one who says in the morning and evening, it will be his right upon Allah to please him:⁴²

"Radeethu billahi rabbann, wa bil Islaami deenaw wa bi Muhammadin Nabiyyaa."43

In another narration, these words are to be repeated three times.44 And remember the hadith of Musa (Upon him be peace) - from page twelve - on how Allah pleases the dweller of Jannah who is of the least Rank?

3. THANK ALLAH COMPLETELY FOR THE DAY

A few words recited in the morning and evening would be counted for having thanked Allah for the entire day, as the Prophet has said⁴⁵: "The one who says (this) in the morning, then indeed he will have expressed a complete shukr or thanks for all the bounties of the day; and the one who says the same in the evening will have expressed a complete thanks for all the bounties of the night:

Allahumma maa Asbaha bi min ni'mathan faminka wahdhaka, laa shareeka laka, falakal hamdu wa lakash-shukr.46 For evening, " اَمْسَى to amsa اَصْبَحَ to amsa أَصْبَحَ

GET THE PROPHET'S (Peace be upon him) **INTERCESSION**

Don't miss the chance of receiving the Prophet's (Peace be upon him) intercession, who said: "Who recites blessings upon me (i.e. says)

Allahumma Salli wa Sallim 'alaa Nabiyyinaa Muhammad⁴⁷ Ten times in the morning and evening will obtain my intercession on the Day of Resurrection."48

The Mu'min makes Du'a

"And your Rabb said: 'Invoke Me,

I will respond to your (invocation)." [40:60]

1. *Du'A* is the Best Worship

Whenever you make du'a to your Lord, then you are worshipping him in the best way, for the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said:

"The best worship is du'a (supplication)."49

2. YOUR EVERY *DU'A* IS ACCEPTED

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"Indeed is your Lord Most Generous, when a slave of His raises his hands with needs before Him, he feels haya [shyness, modesty] to turn him down empty-handed."50

So know my brother or sister in faith, that your Lord will definitely, yes definitely grant all that you ask of him, and if you do not make *Du'a* to Him, then...

3. HE WILL BE DISPLEASED

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"Allah is angry with the one who does not invoke him."51

Look how generous your Rabb is, who is displeased when you don't invoke him. Our asking from those around us even a few times, could result in their displeasure, but Allah - the Lord of the 'Alamin is telling you 'Ask of Me, I will certainly grant you, but don't do otherwise.'

4. THE DU'A READ MOST OFTEN

Anas (May Allah be pleased with him) reported⁵²: The du'a most often recited by the Prophet (Peace be upon him) was:

"Allahumma aatina fid-dunya hasanatan, wa fil-aakhirati hasanatan, wa qina 'adhab-annar"⁵³

When a companion asked Umm Salamah (May Allah be pleased with her), "O Mother of the Believers! Which supplication did the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) make frequently when he was in your house?" She said:

"He supplicated frequently: 'Yaa Muqallibal-quloobi, thabbit *qalbi 'ala deenik.'*"⁵⁴ – This has been recorded by *At-Tirmidhi*.

5. ALLAH WILL ANSWER WITH THIS DU'A:

Narrated Buraida (May Allah be pleased with him): The Prophet (Peace be upon him) heard a man saying:

Allahumma innee as-aluka biannee ash hadhu annaka anthallah. Laa ilaaha illaa anth. Al Ahadus Samad, Alladhee lam yalidh wa lam yoo ladh, wa lam ya kullahoo kufuwan Ahad.⁵⁵

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) then said: "He has asked Allah by His Name by which when asked He gives, and by which when supplicated, He answers." 56

6. LET THE ANGELS MAKE DU'A FOR YOU

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"Whenever a Muslim supplicates for his (Muslim) brother in his absence, the angels say: 'May the same be for you to'."57

How easy it is for us to attain these words from the angels whose supplications are sure to be answered.

So whatever *du'a* that you make for your brother or sister – be it for his or her forgiveness or to admit him or her to Jannah – know that it is accepted for both of you.

EVERY DU'A IS ACCEPTED UNTIL... 7.

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"The supplication of every one of you will be granted if he does not get impatient and say: 'I supplicated my Rabb but my prayer has not been granted."

We learn from this hadith that every du'a is accepted until it is met with frustration. The Prophet (Peace be upon him) has also mentioned that the du'a of every believer is answered either immediately, or an incoming harm is lifted away, or it is stored for the believer in the hereafter, which will be discussed further on.

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said, "When any one of you has performed Salat and wants to supplicate, let him praise Allah first then glorify Him in the beginning and then he should supplicate Allah for me (i.e. send Salawat). Then he may supplicate for whatever he likes."58

To this effect, Imam Qasim bin 'Abd said: "I said to Anas bin Malik, "O Abu Hamzah pray for us." He said, "Du'a is elevated by good deeds." And apt is the reminder of Imam Abu Hanifah: "Have the same relations with Allah inwardly, as you profess outwardly."

The Mu'min sends Salawat upon his Prophet

1. SEND SALAWAT ON THE PROPHET

A Muslim sends Salawat (honor, grace, peace blessings etc) on his Prophet, for he, (Peace be upon him) said,

"Whoever asks Allah to send peace and blessings upon me; then Allah will send peace and blessings upon him ten times."59

And it states in another narration, "Allah will raise him by ten ranks, and write for him ten virtues and erase ten sins from him."60 Please see hadith 4 in "The Adhkaar of Morning and Evening" for the manner in sending Salawat. And do not forget the words of the Prophet (Peace be upon him) who said: "Supplicate Allah for me, for your supplication reaches me wherever you are."61

2. STAY CLOSE TO THE PROPHET (Peace be upon him) ON THE DAY OF RESURRECTION

Don't you wish to be close to the Prophet (Peace be upon him) on Youmal Qiyamah? If yes, then he, (Peace be upon him) said:

"The people who will be nearest to me on the Day of Resurrection will be those who send Salawat more often for me."62

THE MU'MIN IS KNOWLEDGEABLE

The Mu'min always seeks Knowledge

"Say: 'Are those who know, equal to those who know not?"" [39:9]

1. IT IS OBLIGATORY

should know that seeking knowledge is not optional, but something that's obligatory for them; as Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

"The search for knowledge is obligatory upon every Muslim." 63 That knowledge is not to be confined, the Prophet has said, "Convey from me, even if it is an Aayah."64

2. ALLAH WANTS GOOD FOR YOU

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) said:

"When Allah wishes good for someone, He bestows upon him the understanding of Deen."65

That you have been learning *Deen* comes as excellent news for you - as Allah likes you and wants good for you. Your reading this, proves just that.

3. YOU CAN BE THE BEST

Knowledge will not only illuminate you, but it will also make you the best, as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"The best amongst you are those who have the best character provided they have an understanding of Deen."66

4. Make Jannah Easy for You

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"He who follows a path to acquire knowledge, Allah will make the path of Jannah easy to him. The angels lower their wings over the seeker of knowledge, being pleased with what he does."67

5. Let Others do Good-Deeds for You

The one guiding others will get the same rewards as the doer, be it for prayer, fasting, charity, Umrah, Hajj or any other good deed; for Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

"The one who calls or guides others to follow the Right Guidance will have a reward equal to the reward of those who follow him, without their reward being reduced in any respect on that account."68

6. GET THE REWARD OF HAJJ EVERY TIME

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever goes to the Masjid, not desiring anything other than learning or teaching something good, his reward is like that of a Haaji who performs a complete Hajj."69

So the next time you leave to listen to the Friday khutbah or simply to learn or teach at the mosque, know that you are getting the reward of a complete Hajj! Subhanallah!

7. REWARD FOR ALL THAT'S RECITED

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever teaches a verse from the book of Allah-the Mighty and Sublime, will have the reward for having done so for all that is recited thereby."70

ALTHOUGH THE VIRTUES OF KNOWLEDGE are uncountable, one must not forget Mu'adh bin Jabal's (May Allah be pleased with him) words as narrated in Hilyat ul-Awliya: "Learn whatever knowledge you wish to acquire, and Allah will not reward you, unless you act upon what you have learned"

The Rank of an 'Aalim

ALLAH INCLUDED THEM IN THE SHAHADAH

Scholars have been given a tremendous status by Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala. Our Lord has honored them immensely by making them witnesses to the greatest of truths – by mentioning their testimony alongside His Own, and that of His angels! Scholars are thus, its proofs and its signs, indicating His Tawhid. And that indeed, is the greatest honor ever bestowed upon them. Allah says:

"Allah bears witness that La ilaha illa Huwa (none has the right to be worshipped but He), and the angels, and those having knowledge (also give this witness)." [3: 18]

2. ALLAH HAS RAISED THEIR STATUS IN BOTH THE Worlds

Is this not a magnificent honor and reward for those learned in Deen, both in this world and the next; as Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala says:

"Allah will exalt in degree those of you who believe, and those who have been granted knowledge" [58: 11]

3. THEY HAVE BEEN LIKENED TO PROPHETS

Scholars have also been likened to Prophets; and how glorious is this position both in honor and reward! May Allah be praised. Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

"The superiority of the Scholar over the worshipper is like My superiority over the most inferior amongst you."71

4. They are the Heirs of the Prophets

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said:

"The Scholars are the heirs of the Prophets"⁷²

Alhamdulillah! Look my dear brother or sister, now that you know that none receives a greater reward than the scholars, then why not become one? All it takes is an intention, and Allah will most definitely take you forward. That's how people from all ages and background are becoming the 'Ulama of *Deen* alongside their study and work.

You could begin with a teacher by learning a line of knowledge, or memorizing an Aayah from the Qur'an, if by that, you intend hifz. And remember the words of the Prophet (Peace be upon him):

"One will be raised alive after death in the same state in which he died." 73

THE MU'MIN'S **SALAT**

Salat - The Pillar of Deen

"Verily! I am Allah! None has the right to be worshipped but I, so worship Me, and perform As-Salat for My Remembrance." [20:14]

1. THE PROPHET'S (Peace be upon him) LAST WORDS

Ali (May Allah be pleased with him) narrates that the last words of the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) were:

"As-Salat, As-Salat; (and) I warn you about those whom your right hand possesses (i.e. your subordinates)." 74

That the Prophet (Peace be upon him) reminded us of Salat in his last moments, signifies its sublime status in Deen. He, (Peace be upon him) also said: "The comfort and delight of my eyes is in Salat."75

2. THE MOST SUPERIOR DEED

No other deed can surpass As-Salat as the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"The most superior deed is As-Salat, at the beginning of its time." ⁷⁶

3. EASY ENTRANCE FOR WOMEN IN JANNAH

See O Sister in Iman, how easily you can enter Jannah with your Salat, for the Prophet (Peace be upon him) has said:

"If a woman prays regularly five times a day, fasts the month (of Ramadan), guards her chastity and obeys her husband, it will be said to her: 'Enter Jannah from whichever gate you wish.'"77

4. THEIR UNMATCHED REWARDS

Umm Humayd Al-Saa'idiyyah (May Allah be pleased with her) said that she came to the Prophet (Peace be upon him) and said: "O Messenger of Allah, I love to pray with you." He (Peace be upon him) said:

"I know that you love to pray with me, but your praying in your room is better for you than your praying in your house, and your praying in your house is better for you than your praying in the mosque of your people, and your praying in the mosque of your people is better for you than your praying in my mosque."78

And Ahmad narrates that he, (Peace be upon him) said: "Prayer in this Masjid of mine is superior to a thousand prayers elsewhere."

The Virtues of Wudu

1. SINS DEPART IN WUDU

"Wudu is half the Iman"⁷⁹, and doing it causes sins to depart with ease; for Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

"He who performs the wudu perfectly, his sins will depart from his body, even from under his nails."80

2. THE GATES OF JANNAH OPEN FOR YOU

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said⁸¹:

"Whoever of you performs wudu carefully and then says: 'Ash hadu an la ilaha illallahu Wahdahu la shareeka Lahu, wa ash hadu anna Muhammadan 'abduhu wa Rasooluhu, 82 the eight gates of Jannah are opened for him. He may enter through whichever of these gates he likes."

The distance between the two gate-panels of one of the gates of Jannah is the distance of forty-year's walking83. So who amongst us wouldn't love for these gates to open easily?

The Great Virtues of Jama'th

1. *Du'as* are Granted after Adhan

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said,

"Say as they say (i.e. the Muaddhins) and when you finish ask (from Allah) and you will be granted."84

An Abu Dawud hadith also states that "The supplication made between the Adhan and the Igamah is never rejected." So let's not let go of these chances to ask from Allah, of what we desire.

2. AL-WASEELAH

Let the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) intercede for You, as he said:

"He who says upon hearing the Adhan: 'Allahumma Rabba ttaammati, wassalaatil haadhihid da'wati qaa'imati, Muhammadanil wasilata wal fadhilata, wab'athu maqaaman Mahmooda nilladhee wa 'adtahu⁸⁵, it becomes binding upon me to intercede for him on the Day of Resurrection."

3. THE VIRTUES OF JAMA'TH

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

« صَلاةُ الرَّجُل في جَمَاعةٍ تُضَعَّفُ عَلَى صَلاتِهِ فِي بَيْتهِ وفي سُوقِهِ خَمْساً وَعِشْرينَ ضِعْفَاً ، وَذَلِكَ أَنَّهُ إِذَا تَوَضَّا فَأَحْسَنَ الوُضُوءَ ، ثُمَّ خَرَجَ إِلَى المِسْجِدِ ، لا يُخرِجُهُ إلا الصَّلاةُ ، لَمْ يَخْطُ خَطْوَةً إلا رُفِعَتْ لَهُ بِهَا دَرَجَةٌ ، وَحُطَّتْ عَنهُ بِهَا خَطِيئَةٌ ، فَإِذَا صَلَّى لَمْ تَزَلِ المِلائِكَةُ تُصَلِّي عَلَيْهِ مَا دَامَ فِي مُصَلاهُ ، مَا لَمْ يُحْدِث تقولُ : اللَّهُمَّ صَلَّ عَلَيهِ ، اللَّهُمَّ ارْحَمْهُ ، وَلا يَزَالُ فِي صَلاةٍ مَا انْتَظَرَ الصَّلاةَ »

"A man's Salat in a Jama'th is twenty-five times⁸⁶ more rewarding than his Salat at home or in his shop, and that is because when he performs his Wudu properly and proceeds towards the mosque with the purpose of performing Salat in congregation, he does not take a step without being raised a degree (in rank) for it, and having a sin remitted for it, till he enters the mosque. When he is performing Salat, the angels continue to invoke Blessings of Allah on him as long as he is in his place of worship in a state of Wudu. They say: 'O Allah! Have mercy on him! O Allah! Forgive him.' He is deemed to be engaged in Salat as long as he waits for it."87

May Allah be praised! How many are the benefits of a Jama'th: "Better than twenty five prayers; a rank in Jannah raised with a sin wiped out for each step (and we've read how the rank of the least one there is); and if you're waiting for it in the Masjid-then you are actually in Salat, with the du'a of angels."

4. THE REWARD OF HAJJ!

How easy is it to get the reward of Hajj five times everyday, as the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"The one who leaves his house with wudu to offer fard Salat, his reward is like that of a person performing Hajj in Ihram."88

5. THE NUMBERLESS REWARDS OF JUMU'AH

Aws ibn Aws Thaqaff (May Allah be pleased with him) narrated that the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"He who takes a bath properly on Friday, hastens to the Masjid very early and goes on foot and does not go riding, sits close to the Imam and listens (to the sermon) attentively, does not speak at all - then for each step (that he has taken) he will get the reward of one year's fasting and one year of offering Salat at night."89

May Allah be praised! Each of us could make up for all undone virtues, and hope to earn more by way of these words. Moreover, there exist many other virtues of the Jumu'ah prayer, which include a person's (as one above) sins being forgiven from the present and the last Jumu'ah. 90

The Mu'min's Khushu in Salat



"And stand before Allah with obedience." [2: 238]

That immense significance has been given to "Khushu" in prayer is evident in the words of Umar bin al-Khattab (May Allah be pleased with him), who said while standing on the minbar: "A man might have white hair in Islam [i.e. grown old as a Muslim], yet he has not completed even a single prayer for Allah, the Exalted!" He was asked, "Why is that?' He replied: "He does not perfect the prayer's required Khushu, solemnness, and attending to Allah with his heart."91

So O believers, how can any other good deed of the slave stand to be accepted, when his Salat will be the first thing that he will be called to account for, on the Day of Resurrection?92

1. WHAT IS KHUSHU?

"Khushu" means that the heart stands before the Lord in humility and submission."93This humility in-turn, is reflected on his or her body.

2. WHY IS IT IMPORTANT?

It was reported that Ibn Abbas (May Allah be pleased with him) said: "You will only have from your prayer, that which you focused on."94 And the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"Indeed a person completes his Salat, and only one-tenth, from the maximum reward is written for him. Likewise for some, one-ninth, one-eighth, one-seventh, one-sixth, one-fifth, one-fourth, one-third or half of it is written."95

3. How does One increase His Khushu?

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"Offer Salat like the one who is bidding farewell to the world; and as though you see Allah, and if you do not see Him, truly He sees you."⁹⁶

We have been commanded to pray "as though it is our last Salat", and this is correct because no-one knows if he could live to pray another Salat; and "as though we are seeing Allah or that He is seeing us." You should know that you are standing before Rabb-ul 'Alamin, and remember the words of Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him):

"Verily, when a man stands for Salat, Allah turns His attention toward him until he completes his Salat or commits an act against the dedication of Salat."97

The Virtues of Nafl Salat

1. BUILD A PALACE FOR YOURSELF IN JANNAH

For Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

"A house will be built in Jannah for every Muslim who offers twelve Rak'ah of optional Salat other than the fard Salat in a day and a night."98

2. Don't you Wish for the "Ghurafaa"?

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"In Jannah there are dwellings whose inside can be seen from the outside, and the outside can be seen from inside. Allah has prepared them for those who feed the hungry, spread the greetings of Salaam, and pray at night whilst the people are asleep."99

Imam Ibn Kathir said: "These will be lofty palaces, lofty Rooms, one above another, story upon story, well-constructed, strong and decorated." Moreover, there exist many virtues of Tahajjud for "it was the tradition of the Saliheen and a means of gaining closeness to Allah."100 Any Salat offered after Isha will be counted as Tahajjud.101

THE MU'MIN IS **CHARITABLE**

The Mu'min's Zakah¹⁰² & Sadaqah

"And perform As-Salat and give Zakat, and whatever of good (deeds) you send forth for yourselves before you, you shall find it with Allah." [2:110]

1. HALF A DATE CAN SAVE YOU FROM HELL

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said,

"Protect yourself from Hell-fire even by giving half a date as charity." 103

We learn from this hadith that Hell-fire could be averted by a half a date, though it's almost close to nothing monetarily. Another hadith says that anything given the value of a date which has been legally earned is accepted and saved by Allah until it becomes like a mountain. 104

2. ALLAH WILL SPEND ON YOU

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said,

"Allah, the Exalted, says, 'Spend (in charity), and I will spend on you." 105

When Allah 'Azza wa Jall Himself says that He will spend on us, then we cannot even imagine what those delights would be. After all, He is Malik-ul Amlaak.

3. THE MOST EXCELLENT SADAQAH

The one who has little, yet gives something for the sake of Allah - is the most excellent Sadaqah, as the Messenger of Allah (*Peace be upon him*) has said:

"The most excellent Sadaqah is that given in a state of difficulty by one who has little (monetarily)."106

4. Sponsoring the Orphan gives You the Best

A small amount could allow you the company of Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) in Jannah, as he said:

"I, and the one who brings up an orphan, will be like this in Jannah." And he pointed his forefinger and middle finger with a slight gap in between them. 107

5. THE MASSIVE REWARD FOR BUILDING A MASJID

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said,

"Whoever builds a masjid for Allah, even if it is as small as the nestling-place scratched out by the sandgrouse for its eggs, Allah will build a house for him in Jannah."108

The sandgrouse, which is a small pigeon-like bird, takes up very little space to nestle. So remember, your few rupees would be more than enough to build a beautiful Palace for you in Jannah.

THE MU'MIN'S **PILGRIMAGE**

The Mu'min's Hajj & Umrah

"And proclaim to mankind the Hajj (pilgrimage). They will come to you on foot and on every lean camel, they will come from every deep and distant (wide) mountain highway (to perform Hajj)." [22: 27]

Ibn 'Abbaas (May Allah be pleased with him) said, "When Allah commanded Prophet Ibrahim (Upon him be peace) to proclaim Hajj among people, he said:

'My Lord, how can I convey the message to the people as my voice cannot reach them?' Allah said, 'You call, it is Our duty to make it reach (everyone)!' So, he stood in his position and said, 'O you people! Your Lord has chosen a House, so perform pilgrimage to it.'

It was said that the mountains became leveled and his voice reached all parts of the earth and all that are in the wombs and loins of men were made to hear the call and everything that heard it, responded. So those for whom Allah has decreed to perform Hajj till the Day of Judgment responded with the saying,

'Labbayk Allahumma Labbayk Here I am at your service, O Allah, here I am." 109

1. THE HAJJI RETURNS AS A NEWBORN BABY

Indeed fortunate are those, who return sinless as the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever performs Hajj and does not have sexual relations (with his wife), nor commits sin, nor disputes unjustly (during Hajj), then he returns from Hajj as pure and free from sins as on the day on which his mother gave birth to him."110

2. THE VIRTUES OF UMRAH & HAJJ

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

"(The performance of) 'Umrah is an expiation for the sins committed between it and the previous 'Umrah; and the reward of Hajj Mabrur¹¹¹ is nothing but Jannah."¹¹²

3. DO HAJJ WITH THE PROPHET (Peace be upon him)

How would it be if you were told that you could perform Hajj with the Prophet (Peace be upon him). The good news is that it's still possible for he (Peace be upon him), has said: 113

"To perform 'Umrah during Ramadan is equal to the performance of Hajj with Me." 114

THE MU'MIN'S **FASTING**

The Mu'min's Ramadan

﴿ يَا أَيُّهَا الَّذِينَ آمَنُوا كُتِبَ عَلَيْكُمُ الصِّيَامُ كَمَا كُتِبَ عَلَى الَّذِينَ مِنْ قَبْلِكُمْ لَعَلَّكُمْ تَتَّقُونَ ﴾

"O you who believe! Observing fasting is prescribed for you as it was prescribed for those before you, that you may become Al-Muttagun (Ríghteous)." [2: 183]

1. FASTING IN THE MONTH OF RAMADAN

Ibadah in the blessed month of Ramadan will cause the forgiveness of sins as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever fasts the month of Ramadan with faith and seeking reward will be forgiven his previous sins."115

2. THE GREATNESS OF RAMADAN

The reward for deeds are multiplied phenomenally in the month of Ramadan as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever intends drawing close to Allah by performing any virtuous deed (in Ramadan), for such a person will be the reward like the one who had performed a Fard at any other time. And whoever performs a Fard, shall be blessed with the reward of seventy Faraaid at any other time."116

3. Get Rewards of Extra Fasts

You could be rewarded for multiple fasts by following these words of the Prophet's (Peace be upon him):

"Whoever feeds the person who is breaking his fast, will receive a reward like the fasting person's reward; without the reward of the fasting person being diminished in the least."117

4. THE REWARD OF QUENCHING THE THIRST

Quenching a fasting person's thirst will allow you to drink from the Prophet's (Peace be upon him) Haud as he said:

"And the one who gave a fasting person water to drink, Allah will grant him (the giver) to drink from My fountain (Haud), such a drink whereafter that person will never again feel thirsty until he enters Jannah." 118

5. THE GLORY OF LAYLATUL-QADR

The Qur'an says: "The night of Al-Qadr (Decree) is better than a thousand months (i.e. worshipping Allah in that night is better than worshipping Him a thousand months i.e. 83 years & 4 months)"[97:3]. Moreover, the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever stands for prayer during Laylatul Qadr with faith and seeking reward, he will be forgiven for his previous sins."119

The Virtues of Nafl Fasts

Wouldn't you like to be rewarded as if fasting always? If so,

1. FAST THREE DAYS EVERY MONTH

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) said:

"Fasting three days every month is the same as fasting all the time (i.e. the entire year)."120

2. FAST SIX DAYS IN SHAWWAL

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever fasts the month of Ramadan and follows it up by fasting six days of the month of Shawaal, it is as if he fasted all of the time. 121

3. FAST THE DAY OF 'ARAFAH

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) said:

"Fasting the day of 'Arafah expiates (the sins of) the previous year and the coming year."122

And Muslim records that the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said: "And fasting the day of Aashuraa, I reckon that Allah will expiate (the sins of) the year that preceded it."

THE MU'MIN HAS A BEAUTIFUL **CHARACTER**

The Mu'min's Character

"And verily, you (O Muhammad) are on an exalted (standard of) character." [68:4]

Ummul Mu'mineen 'Aisha described him (Peace be upon him): "His character was just [a reflection of] the Qur'an." And Anas (May Allah be pleased with him) said, "I served him (peace be upon him) for ten years, and he never said 'Uff' to me."124

1. THE BEST

Undoubtedly, the one endowed with good manners and character is second to none, as the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said,

"The best of you is the best among you in character." 125

2. THE MOST PERFECT

The person with good character, is also the one with a perfect *Iman*, as the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said,

"The most perfect believer in faith among the believers is the one whose character is most excellent."126

3. THE REWARDS OF CONSTANT PRAYING & FASTING

On virtue of good character, you could be reckoned from those who are constantly at prayer or fasting, for the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said,

"A believer will attain by his good character the rank of one who prays during the night and observes fasting during the day." 127

4. A HOUSE IN THE HIGHEST JANNAH

What's more? The one with good character would receive the glad tidings of the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) who said, "Anaa za'eemun" or I guarantee,

A house in the highest part of Jannah for one who has good character." ¹²⁸

5. THE ONE FOR WHOM HELL-FIRE IS FORBIDDEN

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said, "Shall I not tell you whom the (Hell) Fire is forbidden to touch?"

"It is forbidden to touch a man who is always accessible, having polite and tender nature."129

Let all of us avert Hell-fire by being accessible and polite with everyone – be they our elders, our children, or our workers.

6. THE DEAREST TO THE PROPHET (Peace be upon him)

Could there be anything better than Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) saying:

dearest and nearest among you to me on the Day of Resurrection will be one who is the best of you in character." ¹³⁰

7. SUPPRESSING ANGER

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) said,

"The one who suppresses his anger when he was capable of giving vent to it, will be called out by Allah Ta'ala before all the creatures on the day of resurrection; and he will be asked to choose any of the Hur-al 'Ayn that he likes". 131

The patience of a few moments would bring for you, endless delights. And "the one who guides others to this will be rewarded equally like that of its doer."132 Remember dear brothers and sisters in Iman, "Whoever restrains his anger, Allah will restrain His punishment from him on Youmal Qiyamah."133

And beautiful indeed are Imam Ibn Al-Jawziyyah's words to conclude our focus on good character: "Be in this world as the bee: it eats only good, produces only good, and when it rests upon anything it neither ruins it nor deflowers it."

The Mu'min with his Wife

"And live with them honourably" [4:19]

1. HE IS ALWAYS GOOD TO HER

A man shows good treatment to women, who could be his mother, his wife, his sister, his daughter or his aunt for the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has advised us saying:

"Take good care of women" 134

2. SHE DECIDES IF YOU ARE THE "BEST" MUSLIM

Yes! If you are good with her, then be happy, as Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

The best of you are those who are the best to their wives". 135

3. He is Affectionate with Her

A good husband is kind and merciful with his wife. The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

«

"Whatever you spend seeking thereby the Pleasure of Allah, will have its reward, even the morsel of food which you raise to your wife's mouth."136

May Allah be praised who sent us His Messenger (Peace be upon him), who taught us that raising a mouthful to our wives would fetch a reward upon seeking Allah's pleasure! How beautiful is this hadith, and how many relationships have revived with a smile upon following it.

4. HE NEVER FORGETS THE GOODNESS IN HER

An adorable and a lasting relationship between the spouses could be achieved, upon following the words of the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him), who said:

"A believer must not hate (his wife) believing woman; if he dislikes one of her characteristics he will be pleased with another." 137

A good husband is easy on his wife and does not remind her about her shortcomings or use abusive language against her.

5. HE AVOIDS AN ARGUMENT WITH HER

The next time he is tempted into an argument, let him remember what the Prophet (Peace be upon him), said,

"I guarantee a house in Jannah for one who gives up arguing, even if he is in the right."138

And Umar bin Al-Khattab (May Allah be pleased with him) would say: "Women's anger should be dealt by remaining quiet."

6. HE DOES NOT ILL-TREAT HER

'Abdullah bin Zam'ah (May Allah be pleased with him) reported that he heard the Prophet (Peace be upon him) give a sermon wherein he had made mention of women saying,

"How can anyone of you beat his wife as if she were a slave, and then expect to embrace her at night?"139

When read in the context of the sermon, the Prophet's (Peace be upon him) tone clearly suggests that he was admonishing those who ill-treated their wives. As such, those husbands who find mention in these words are indeed at great loss!

The Mu'min husband sees the impeccable example of his Prophet (Peace be upon him) who never hit anyone with his hand – neither a woman, nor a servant. 140

7. HE DOES NOT NEGLECT HER

A good husband is far from being apathetic¹⁴¹, stingy and tight-pursed with his dependents. He fears the words of Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him), who said:

"Neglecting one's own dependents is a reason enough for a man to commit a sin."142

The Mu'minah with her Husband

"Therefore the righteous women are devoutly obedient (to Allah and to their husbands), and guard in the husband's absence what Allah orders them to guard." [4:34]

1. THE BEST WOMAN

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) was asked: "Who is the best woman?" He replied:

"She who pleases her husband when he looks at her, obeys him when he instructs her, and who does not oppose him regarding herself and her riches, fearing his displeasure."143

These words of the Prophet (Peace be upon him) describe the best of women. And needless to say, when they are followed, not only would she be in the highest of the ranks; but that would also bring about a delightful, lasting relationship.

2. AND SUCH A WIFE IS GUARANTEED JANNAH

Absolutely! For the Prophet (Peace be upon him) has said:

"Any woman dies while her husband is pleased with her, she will enter Jannah."144

3. SHE IS THE BEST OF THIS WORLD!

If she is righteous, then there is nothing better in this world than her, for Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

"This world (i.e. its contents) is a provision; and the best provision of the world is a righteous woman."145

4. SHE IS A GUARDIAN & A CARE-TAKER

She knows that she is the guardian at her husband's house and makes sure that her children are raised on Deen - for the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"The woman is a guardian in her husband's house her children" 146

5. SHE IS NOT UNGRATEFUL

Asma bint Yazeed (May Allah be pleased with her) relates that the Prophet (Peace be upon him) cautioned women from ingratitude towards their husbands saying:

"One of you may stay unmarried for a long time, living with her parents, then Allah-the Mighty and Sublime, blesses her with a husband and blesses her with wealth and children from him, then she becomes angry and says, 'I have never seen good from you!'"147

A Mu'mina wife takes these words seriously, for she knows the saying of her Prophet (Peace be upon him): "I was shown the Hell-fire and that the majority of its dwellers were women who were disbelievers or <u>ungrateful.</u>"148

As recorded in Bukhari, the Prophet (Peace be upon him) gave his wife Khadija (May Allah be pleased with her), the glad tidings of "a palace of hollowed pearls in Jannah." Imam Ibn Kathir said: "This was because she never raised her voice over that of the Prophet (Peace be upon him) and was never displeased with him even for a day, and she never harmed in any way."

And never forget that the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said that from the dwellers of Jannah is, "That woman, who when her husband becomes angry - goes to him, placing her hand upon him, and then saying, 'I will not taste any sleep until you are pleased.'"149

A Note to my Brothers & Sisters in Marriage

I wish to conclude these two chapters with a beautiful hadith of the Prophet (Peace be upon him) – which when acted upon, would only bring clouds of bliss to rain upon comfort in your marriage Inshallah. He (Peace be upon him), said:

"A believer loves and is loved. There is no goodness in the one, who neither loves nor is loved."150

1. THE ONE WHOM ALLAH LOVES THE MOST

How very easy is to be the one whom Allah loves the most, by following these words of the Prophet (Peace be upon him):

"The slave whom Allah Ta'ala loves the most, is the one who is most beneficial to his family."151

He, (Peace be upon him) has also said, "The best of you is he who is the best to his family, and I am the best to my family." 152

2. THE MOST EXCELLENT CHARITY

The next time you spend on your family for Allah's sake, then you should know that it's the most excellent charity; for the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said:

"The most excellent dinar (money in charity) is one that a person spends on his family." 153

3. HONORING GUESTS

Let none of us take lightly what the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said about taking care of guests:

"Whoever believes in Allah and the Last day should honor his guests." 154

Parents & Children in the Mu'min's Life

"And your Rabb has decreed that you worship none but Him. And that you be dutiful to your parents. If one of them or both of them attain old age in your life, say not to them a word of disrespect, nor shout at them, but address them in terms of honor." [17:23]

1. THE BEST

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"The best of the people is a believer in the service of two noble parents."155

Kindness to parents has also been answered to be "the deed most loved by Allah after Salat (which was answered first)."156 While the rights of the mother has also been told to be three times more important than the father¹⁵⁷; it has been narrated that "Allah's pleasure lies in the pleasure of the father" 158. Al-Bukhari also records, "and (of the) major sins after ascribing partners to Allah is to "disobey parents."

2. BEING JUST & LOVING WITH CHILDREN

Justice and love for children has been ordered frequently by the Prophet (Peace be upon him), who would even admonish some parents for ill-treating their children. He also said:

"Be just among your children, when it comes to giving to them. Were I to prefer some children over some others, I would prefer girls." 159

3. THE HIGH-STATUS OF DAUGHTERS

That daughters are raised honorably, and not insulted, offended or preferred over the son; invites the glad-tidings of the Prophet (Peace be upon him) who said:

"If anyone has a baby girl and he neither buries her alive, nor slights her, nor prefers his son over her; then Allah because of her, will send him to Jannah."160

4. THE PARENT OF DAUGHTERS IS WITH THE PROPHET (Peace be upon him) IN JANNAH

How fortunate are the parents of daughters, for Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said:

"If anyone brings up two girls - he and I will be together in Jannah like these two fingers; pointing with his two fingers."161

The Mu'min is Best to his Companions

1. THE BEST

The one helping and benefitting others is the best amongst all, as the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said:

"The best amongst people is the one who benefits people the most." 162

2. ALLAH WILL FULFILL YOUR NEEDS

A simple help that you render for your brother, could easily help you in fulfilling your needs from this world or the next, as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said:

"If anyone fulfills his brother's needs, Allah will fulfill his needs." 163

3. It is Better than Ten Years of Ihti'QAF

How great is this reward as the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said: « مَنْ مَشَى فِيْ حَاجَةِ أَخِيْهِ كَانَ خَيْراً لَهُ مِن اعْتِكَافِهِ عَشْرَ سِنِيْنَ ، وَ مَن اعْتِكَفَ يَوْمًا ابْتِغَاءَ وَجْهِ للهِ جَعَلَ للهُ بَيْنَهُ وَبَيْنَ النَّارِ ثَلاَثَ خَنَادِكَ ، كُلُّ خَنْدَكٍ ٱبْعَدُ مَا بَيْنَ الْخَافِقَيْنِ » "That one goes out for a brother's need, is better than ten years of Ihti'qaf. And the one who observes Ihti'qaf of one day for Allah's sake - three ditches are placed between him and the Hell-fire. Each ditch is wider than the distance between the world and the heavens."164

4. THE PRAYER OF SEVENTY THOUSAND ANGELS

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"When a Muslim visits a sick Muslim at dawn, seventy thousand angels keep on praying for him till dusk. If he visits him in the evening, seventy thousand angels keep on praying for him till the morning; and he will have (his share of) reaped fruits in Jannah." 165

It has been narrated that "Whosoever visits an ailing person or a brother of his to seek the Pleasure of Allah, an announcer (angel) calls out: 'May you be happy, may your walking be blessed, and may you be awarded a dignified position in Jannah'". 166

5. THE MOST SUPERIOR DEED

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) has said:

"The Most Superior deed is to bring happiness to Your Muslim brother; or to pay his debt for him, or to feed him some bread."167

Abu Dawud also records a hadith that "If any Muslim clothes a Muslim when he is bare, Allah will clothe him with the green garments of Jannah; If any Muslim feeds a Muslim when he is hungry, Allah will feed him with the fruits of Jannah; If any Muslim gives any Muslim a drink when he is thirsty, Allah 'Azza wa Jall will give him drink from Ar-Raheeq Al-Makhthum."

And helping your brother in his distress also is a means of reward, for the Prophet (Peace be upon him said): "No believer comforts his brother in distress, except that Allah clothes him with a dress of nobility on the Day of Resurrection."168To follow funerals is also the right (of the deceased) upon another Muslim."169

6. THE CLOSEST TO ALLAH

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) has said:

"Truly, of all the people worthier to be close to Allah Ta'ala is the one who offers Salam first."170

As-Salam is a name amongst the names of Allah, which He has sent down to this world. 171 He, (Peace be upon him) has said, "Spread Salam so you may be raised high." To reciprocate As-Salam is also a right of a Muslim upon another Muslim. 173

7. A MUSLIM IS A BROTHER TO ANOTHER MUSLIM

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) has said:

"No one of you becomes a true believer until he likes for his brother what he likes for himself."174

The 'Ulama mention that all of the woes and problems of this world will perish should these Prophetic words be followed.

A Muslim also takes care of his brother, for "A Muslim is a brother of (another) Muslim, he neither wrongs him nor does he hand him over to one who does him wrong."175

We have also been urged to put in a word for our brothers by saying, "If you make intercession for him, you will be rewarded" 176

8. THE MU'MIN IS GRACIOUS TO HIS NEIGHBOR

A Mu'min does not forget what the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said about neighbors:

"Whoever believes in Allah and the Last day should do good to his neighbor"177

9. THE MU'MIN IS TRUSTWORTHY

Our Deen has given immense significance to Amaanah or trust, wherein our Prophet (Peace be upon him) himself was known to be Al-Ameen or the trustworthy. Anas bin Malik (May Allah be pleased with him) reported that the Prophet (Peace be upon him) addressed us and said in a sermon:

"He has no Iman who is not trustworthy and he has no Deen who does not keep his promises."178

And remember, our "Deen is naseeha" or sincerity "toward Allah, His Book, His Messenger, leaders of the Muslims and to their people."180

10. THE MU'MIN IS FORGIVING

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) has said:

"The one who forgives the faults of a Muslim, Allah will forgive his faults on the Day of Resurrection." 181

It is narrated that when Musa (Upon him be peace) asked Allah, "Who was the most revered slave to Him?" He, 'Azza wa Jall said: "The one who forgives, despite being able to avenge." 182

Dear brothers and sisters, don't you love for Allah to forgive your faults, and what would our fates be should He not? And Imam Ibnul Arabi would say: "Forgetting the harms caused by the brothers, causes your love of them to persist."

11. THE MU'MIN DOESN'T STOP HIS CHARITY

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) has said:

"Every good deed is charity" 183

We have read before that a date given for the sake of Allah, could save us from Hell or add to our good deeds as a mountain. The Prophet (Peace be upon him) has also said: "Do not think little of any good deed, even meeting your brother with a cheerful face." 184 And always remember, that your smile for a brother is also a Sadaqah. 185

THE MU'MIN IS **STEADFAST**

The Mu'min in Grief

"I am really very sad and my heart cries out in pain. And all those I knew left me when I needed them the most. I don't know what to do."

Remember dear Brother or Sister in Iman,

1. RELATE YOUR GRIEF TO ALLAH

When Prophet Ya'qub (Upon him be peace) was gripped with immense distress, he relates his sorrow to Allah with these words:

"I only complain of my grief and sorrow to Allah" [12: 86]

2. He is Always there for You

Even if people have caused you pain and deserted you, don't think even for an instant that You are all alone. You should know that your Lord is always there for you and loves you. Neither has He left you, nor does he hate you. He says unto you just as He said to His Prophet (Peace be upon him) in Surah Ad-Duha when he was greatly aggrieved:

"Your Lord (O Muhammad) has neither forsaken you nor hates you." [93: 3]

3. HE KNOWS YOUR GRIEF & HE PRESCRIBES THE WAY

Your Creator is *Aleem*, The All-Knower, Who knows the state of your heart, and that He has revealed verses of consolation to His Prophet (Peace be upon him) which are for You:

"And We know that your heart feels distressed for what they say" [15: 97]

And Allah Says in the next verse,

"So glorify the praises of your Lord and be among those who prostrate." [15: 98]

The Dhikr of Allah

The dhikr of Allah will comfort your heart and bring solace to it – as He, Subhanahu wa Ta'ala says:

"Verily, in the remembrance of Allah do hearts find rest."[13: 28]

Sheikh Ali Abdur-Rahman Al-Hudhaifi, the Imam of Masjidun-Nabawi said, "Among the rewards of remembrance of Allah is that it makes one love Allah, increases him in faith, makes his affairs easy, and protects him from the tricks and evil doings of Satan."

4. HE WILL ANSWER YOUR PLEA

Allah Says,

"And when My slaves ask you (O Muhammad) concerning Me, then (answer them), I am indeed near. I respond to the invocations of the supplicant when he calls on Me." [2: 186]

Imam Fuzayl bin 'Iyadh said:

"If you lose hope in all people and you do not ask anything from them, your Lord will give you all that you want."

5. AND NEVER GIVE-UP ON THE MOST MERCIFUL Allah Says:

So never give up on Allah's mercy dear brother or sister, for you are not the one who disbelieves in Him. Know that your calling upon Allah will bring the best for you, even if this period may seem long, as the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said:

"There is not a Muslim on this world who makes D'ua to Allah, Ta'ala except that Allah grants what is asked for; or some trouble is diverted from him equal to his prayer; or a reward is preserved for him (in the hereafter) until he prays for something sinful or for breaking relations."

Upon hearing this, a companion said: "Then we shall supplicate to Allah more often", for which the Prophet (Peace be upon him) replied:

"Allah can give you even more (than you think)." 186

To this effect, there appears a narration on the authority of Jabir, which says:

"When Allah will grant a slave heaps of rewards in the hereafter in return for supplications that were apparently not answered in the world, he will say: 'Alas! (how I wish) none of my supplications were answered in the world (so I was rewarded for all of them here). 187

So do not despair but rejoice my dear brother or sister with the Prophet's (Peace be upon him) words: "Allah can give you even more than you think."

The Mu'min is Enduring

"I am the only one who knows the calamity that has befallen me. No one can even imagine what I'm going through."

Remember dear Brother or Sister in Iman,

1. This Life is a Test

Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala Says,

"And certainly, We shall test you with something of fear, hunger, loss of wealth, lives and fruits, but give glad tidings to the patient." [2: 155]

So dear brother or sister in *Iman*, remember that this life is a test – for the hereafter is indeed forever. And should you patiently bear without grumbling, only for Allah's sake; then He promises you tremendous rewards as it happened with Umm Salamah about which we will read further on.

2. THE REWARDS OF PATIENCE

Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala says:

"Only those who are patient shall receive their reward in full, without reckoning." [39: 10]

Imam Sulayman ibn Qasim said that the reward of every deed is known, except for the reward of patience, which will be like heavy rain. Imam Ahmad said: "Allah has mentioned patience in the Qur'an in ninety places." 188 This highlights the immense significance that has been given to patience.

And Umm Salamah (May Allah be pleased with her) narrates 189, "I heard the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) saying, 'When a person suffers from a calamity and utters:

To Allah we belong and to Him is our return. O Allah! Compensate me in my affliction, recompense my loss and give me something better in exchange for it.

Then Allah surely compensates him with reward and better substitute." Umm Salamah (May Allah be pleased with her) said: "When Abu Salamah died, I repeated the same supplication as the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) had commanded me; So Allah then bestowed upon me the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him as a husband) better than him.

It is believed that she was initially reluctant to bring herself to say "and replace it with something which is better" because she thought, "Who could be better than Abu Salamah?" Allah soon answered her supplication by marrying her to the best – His Prophet (Peace be upon him).

Let all of us remember this *Du'a*, that the grace and blessings of Allah 'Azza wa Jall be upon us always.

3. THE CAUSE FOR EXPIATION OF SINS

The Prophet's (Peace be upon him) words will come as great delight for you:

"Never a believer is stricken with a discomfort, an illness, an anxiety, a grief or mental worry or even the pricking of a thorn but Allah will expiate his sins in lieu of it."190

4. BUT PATIENCE IS AT THE FIRST STRIKE...

Anas narrated that The Prophet (Peace be upon him) passed by a woman, who was crying over her son and said,

"Fear Allah and be patient."

She said, "Away from me! My calamity has not befallen you and you are not aware of it." The woman was later told that it was the Prophet (Peace be upon him who had advised). She came to his door where she found no doorkeeper. She said, "(I am sorry) I did not know you."

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"Indeed, true patience is with the first shock." 191

5. ... AND JANNAH WILL BE YOURS

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"Allah, the Most High Says: 'Son of Adam! If you bear the first affliction patiently for recompense, I will not agree for you a reward less than Jannah." 192

So my dear brother or sister in Islam, know that a strong believer will be favored greatly by Allah, therefore let not your calamities aggrieve you. Imam Ibn Taymiyyah would say: "A calamity that makes you turn to Allah is better for you, than a blessing which makes you forget the remembrance of Allah." Perhaps that is the reason Imam Al-Haram, Sheikh Sa'ud Ash-Shuraim said, "Pain (affliction) is often, a disguised atonement from Allah."

And dear believer, never forget Allah Ta'ala's promise which he repeats twice in Surah Al-Inshirah for you:

"Verily, along with every hardship is relief."

"Verily, along with every hardship is relief." [94: 4 and 5]

The Mu'min Returns to His Lord

"I have done some very-very bad things. I don't know if I will be even forgiven."

My Dear Brother or Sister, Remember what your Prophet (Peace be upon him)said: 193

"I would not take the whole world and its bounties for this verse: 'Say: 'O My slaves who have transgressed against themselves (by committing evil deeds and sins)! Despair not of the Mercy of Allah, verily Allah forgives all sins. Truly, He is Oft-Forgiving, Most Merciful." [39:53]

This verse was revealed when some pagans who had committed terrible sins had approached the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) asking him if their sins too could be atoned. So my dear brother or sister, never despair from the mercy of Allah for w-h-a-t-e-v-e-r sin that may have been done. Your Lord will forgive you no matter what it was. And know that your Lord only wants you to "return" to Him-and that's what "tawbah" translates into.

So Listen to Him in your Prophet's (Peace be upon him) words:

"Allah, the Exalted, has said: 'O son of Adam! I shall go on forgiving you so long as you pray to Me and aspire for My forgiveness whatever may be your sins. O son of Adam! I do not care even if your sins should pile up to the sky and should you beg pardon of Me, I would forgive you. O son of Adam! If you come to Me with an earthful of sins and meet Me, not associating anything with Me in worship, I will match it with an earthful of forgiveness." 194

1. ALLAH IS OVERJOYED WHEN YOU RETURN TO HIM

Dear Brother or Sister, know that your Rabb loves you more than you can imagine. A woman was seen running and searching for her child. And whenever she saw a child, she would take hold of it, press it against her belly and give it a suck. The Prophet (Peace be upon him) said concerning her to his Sahabah:

"Allah is more compassionate to his slave than this woman is to her child."195

And Al-Hafiz Ibn Hajar relates that, "After continuous search, she finally found her baby. She took the baby and hugged him."

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) also said:

"Verily, Allah is more delighted with the repentance of His slave than a person who lost his camel in a desert land and then finds it (unexpectedly)". 196

So know my brother or sister, all you have to do is to return to Him by asking Him forgiveness and thereafter be steady on that promise of abstention.

2. THE BEST FOR SEEKING FORGIVENESS

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said, "The best supplication for seeking forgiveness is to say:

'Allahumma Anta Rabbi, la ilaha illa Anta, khalaqtani wa ana 'abduka, wa ana 'ala 'ahdika wa wa'dika mastata'tu, a'udhu bika min sharri ma sana'tu, abu'u laka bini'matika 'alayya, wa abu'u bidhanbi faghfir li, fa innahu la yaghfirudh-dhunuba illa Anta.""

He who supplicates in these terms during the day with firm belief in it and dies on the same day, he will be one of the dwellers of Jannah; and if anyone supplicates in these terms during the night with firm belief in it and dies before the morning, he will be one of the dwellers of *Jannah.*" ¹⁹⁷

The Perfect Mu'min 198

A BELIEVER NOT ONLY FOLLOWS the fard acts of *Deen*, but he is also the one whose faith is unshakeable and whose reliance on Allah is complete. The more problems he faces, the more his faith becomes strong.

He could pray, and may see that his prayers are not being answered; yet he does not change, because he knows that he is owned by his Lord Who knows what is best for him.

A strong faith opens in strong hardships.

Yahya (Upon him be peace), son of Zakariyya (Upon him be peace), is an excellent example for a Mu'min. He was even killed by a tyrant king; yet, the Prophet remained patient with his Lord's decree. Allah 'Azza wa Jall says in the Qur'an:

"And surely, We shall try you until We test those who strive hard and the patient ones" [47: 31]

Similarly all the Prophets and the believers were tested from Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala. Ya'qub (Upon him be peace) cried for eighty years when his son Yusuf (Upon him be peace), was gone.

refuge in You from the evil of what I have done. I acknowledge the favours that You have bestowed upon me, and I confess my sins. Pardon me, for none but You has the power to pardon

But, he never gave up; all he said when his other son was gone too was:

"May be Allah will bring them (back) all to me" [12: 83]

Musa (Upon him be peace) prayed against Firáwn, who killed children and magicians for 40 years before he was answered.

It is in such situations when the faith of a believer is seen, and not just in fard acts. So when we believe in Allah and are tested from Allah, this test should only increase our submission and pleasure, and not otherwise. And that is the explanation of the meaning of Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala words,

Imam Hasan Al-Basri said: "People are the same in health but when hardship befalls them, they show difference."

Remember O Believers.

We cannot afford to make do without steadfastness in our Iman, as Imam Ibn Taymiyyah said, "Deeds of the hearts, like loving Allah, worshipping Him with sincerity, thanking Him for His favors, bearing His decisions with patience, fearing Him and hoping for what is with Him are all part of the foundations and pillars of the religion."

THE MU'MIN IS **CHASTE**

The Mu'min's Chastity is Undefiled

﴿ قُلْ لِلْمُؤْمِنِينَ يَغُضُّوا مِنْ أَبْصَارِهِمْ وَيَحْفَظُوا فُرُوجَهُمْ ۚ ذَٰلِكَ أَزْكَىٰ لَهُمْ ۗ إِنَّ اللَّهَ خَبِيرٌ بِمَا يَصْنَعُونَ وَقُلْ لِلْمُؤْمِنَاتِ يَغْضُضْنَ مِنْ أَبْصَارِهِنَّ وَيَحْفَظْنَ فُرُوجَهُنَّ ﴾ "Tell the believing men to lower their gaze (from looking at forbidden things), and protect their private parts. That is purer for them. Verily, Allah is All-Aware of what they do. And tell the believing women to lower their gaze (from looking at forbidden things), and protect their private parts." [24:30-31]

1. Don't Follow upon the First

Allah 'Azza wa Jall has prescribed for us a Deen, wherein He has commanded us in His infinite wisdom, to guard ourselves from faahishaa. 199 Jarir bin 'Abdullah (May Allah be pleased with him) said: I asked the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) about the accidental glance (upon a woman not allowed to look at) and he ordered:

A believer knows that acting upon these words of the Prophet (Peace be upon him), is what protects "our" women in our absence. In return, they also check the looker's thoughts before they get the better of him.

2. THE EYE INDULGES IN SIN

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) said,

"The zina of the eye is the (lustful) look."201

There remains a severe torment in store for those who indulge in illicit sex. And should the eye engage in the same, then it too would meet...

3. THE FATE OF THOSE WHO TRESPASS

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) said in a longer narration,

"...and so we set out and came to something like a hole like an oven; with a narrow top and wide bottom, and the fire was kindling underneath that hole. He said, 'We looked inside, and there were naked men and women and there would rise up fire from beneath them and when it reached them, they screamed, and I said, 'Who are these (people) O Jibreel?', He said, 'These are the fornicators.'"202

May Allah save us all of us from being even close to such torment – Ameen

4. NOT A BELIEVER

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) said,

"When the fornicator is committing fornication, he is not a believer." ²⁰³

And when he is not a believer what could his torment be should he or she meet his or her end while at it?

BUT THE ONE WHO REMAINS CHASTE WILL HAVE A "TREMENDOUS" REWARD

Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala Says:

1. THE FIRST TO ENTER JANNAH

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said that the first three to enter Jannah were shown to him, and one of them was "... a Muta'affif or a chaste person." 204

2. ALLAH WILL GIVE YOU BETTER THAN THAT

Yes! Whatever that you have left for the sake of Allah, then Allah the Most High, will give you that which is much more better, for the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said:

"Whosoever leaves something for the sake of Allah; then Allah, will replace it with something better than it."205

3. A MASSIVE REWARD

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) has said,

"Verily the greatness of reward is relative to the greatness of affliction." 206

So know O believers, the greater your patience and steadfastness in the face of restraint, then greater will be Allah's reward that's in store for you. How great? The one who restrains will knows the answer!

4. YOU WILL BE FROM ALLAH'S "CHOSEN SLAVES"

And nothing will equal that! The one who keeps his chastity from faahishaa, will be Inshallah reckoned from the "chosen slaves" of Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala. For the Most High describes Yusuf (Upon him be Peace) with the same, who turned to Him upon seduction from the Ruler's wife:

"Thus it was, that We might turn away from him evil and illegal sexual intercourse. Surely, he was one of Our chosen, (guided) slaves." [12:24]

"So the next time you are tempted to turn back at that beautiful face, remember Allah's promises for You."

THE MU'MIN **BUSINESSMAN**

The Mu'min's Way of Profit

1. THE HONEST BUSINESSMAN'S REWARD

When a Muslim businessman observes truthfulness in his trading and financial transactions, then he deserves the glad tidings of Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) who said,

"A truthful and trustworthy businessman will be among the Prophets, the Siddiqeen (the foremost in the truth), and the Martyrs."207

2. NO GREATER PROFIT-MARGIN THAN THIS:

The Prophet (Peace be upon him) said, "Whoever enters a market and says (the following), Allah will record for him million virtues, and erase a million sins, and raises his status by a million ranks."208

"Laa Ilaaha illallahu wah dahoo laa shareekalahu, lahul mulku walahul Hamdu, yuhyee wa yu meethu, wahuwa hayyul laa yamootu biyadihil khairu wahuwa 'alaa kulli shayy in Qadeer." 209

People are often concerned that their work keeps them from doing Allah's dhikr. But rejoice O my people at work, for this hadith ensures that the rest will have to catch up with You, in terms of rewards.

3. BE THE BEST

As the Prophet (Peace be upon him) said,

"The best of you is the one who is best in repaying his debts." 210 To this effect, we have been ordered to, "Pay the labourer his wages before his sweat dries."211

4. DU'A FOR REPAYING DEBTS

Abu Dawud records that Abu Umamah (May Allah be pleased with him) mentioned to the Prophet (Peace be upon him) that he was surrounded with tensions because of his debts. The Prophet (Peace be upon him) said, "Shall I not teach you those words by saying which Allah will remove your tensions and pay your debts?" He said: "Yes, please tell me, O Messenger of Allah!" He (Peace be upon him) said: "Say in the morning and evening:

"Allahumma innee A'oodhubika minal hammi wal hazani, wa a'oodhubika minal 'Ajzi wal kasali, wa a'oodhubika minal bukhli wal jubni, wa a'oodhubika min ghalabatid-dayni wa qahrir-rijaal."²¹²

Abu Umamah (May Allah be pleased with him) says, "So I did that, and indeed Allah removed my tensions and cleared all my debts."

5. THE BELIEVER DOES NOT DEAL WITH INTEREST

Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala warns us in Surah Al-Bagara,

"O you who believe! Be afraid of Allah and give up what remains from Ríba (usury-Interest), if you are believers. And if you do not do it, then take a notice of war from Allah and His Messenger." [2: 278, 279]

6. THE CURSE OF THE PROPHET

"The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) cursed the one who accepts usury and the one who pays it." 213" and the one who records it, and the two persons who stand witness to it."214

We have to understand that transactions based on usury (interest) could be clouded in different names. Therefore, it becomes all the more important that we exercise care in our monetary dealings. And sufficient for us is Allah's warning in this regard!

Our Deen commends bread earners for the role they play in raising the family - as Umar (May Allah be pleased with him) said, "I would like to breathe my last, only if I am buying for my family or trading." This however is only true for those, whose sustenance comes from a halal source of income.

The Mu'min doesn't indulge in Evil

1. THE MOST EXCELLENT BELIEVER

When the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) was asked: "Who is the most excellent among the Muslims?" He said,

"One from whose tongue and hands the other Muslims are secure." ²¹⁶

The believer knows that he ought to take care of his words and actions, should he hope to become the most excellent one. And the Prophet (Peace be upon him) has said:

"A true believer does not taunt or curse or abuse or talk indecently." 217

2. THE BELIEVER HAS GOOD OPINION OF OTHERS

A believer is good mannered and does not think little of others, and nor does he slight them; for the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) who said,

"It is enough evil for a Muslim to look down upon his (Muslim) brother."218

To this effect Imam Ibn Mazin said, "The believer seeks excuses for his brothers, while the hypocrite seeks out their faults."

3. THE BELIEVER IS NOT ENVIOUS

The believer does not allow his good deeds to be lost and follows the words of the Prophet (Peace be upon him) who said:

"Beware of envy because envy consumes (destroys) the virtues just as the fire consumes the firewood," or he said "grass." 219

4. THE BELIEVER DOES NOT RECALL HIS FAVORS

Reminding others of favors done, invites Allah's punishment, for the Prophet (Peace be upon him) observed: "There are three (types of) people to whom Allah will neither speak on the Day of Resurrection nor look at them, nor purify them, and they will have a painful chastisement." The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) repeated it three times. And one of them is " A Mannan or the one who recounts of his favours done to another."220

5. THE BELIEVER IS NOT ARROGANT

The believer does not allow any vice to come between him and Jannah; not even his pride, for the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"The one who has even a speck of pride will not enter Jannah." 221

The believer is careful from being haughty, for he knows that the arrogant are from "the people of the Hell-fire." 222

6. THE BELIEVER IS NOT ILL-WISHING

A believer does not wish ill for others, remembering the Prophet's (Peace be upon him) admonishment in this regard:

"Do not express pleasure at the misfortune of a (Muslim) brother lest Allah should bestow mercy upon him and make you suffer from a misfortune."223

And a believer is not double-faced with people, as the twofaced, "will have two tongues of fire on Youmal Qiyamah"224

7. THE BELIEVER TURNS AWAY FROM NIFAQ

A believer is fearful of nifaq or hypocrisy just as the Sahabah (May Allah be pleased with them) strived to stay away from it. The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) who said,

"There are three signs of a hypocrite: When he speaks, he lies, when he makes a promise, he breaks it, and when he is trusted, he betrays his trust."225

There exist many punishments for the one who engages his tongue in lies and falsehood. Also, when a man tells a lie, the angels move a mile away from him due to the foul odor that he comes with.²²⁶

Imam Sufyan At-Thawri said, "Do not make a promise to your brother and then break it, so that love turns to hate."

The Mu'min does not Backbite

"And backbite not one another. Would one of you like to eat the flesh of his dead brother? You would hate it (so hate backbiting). And fear Allah. Veríly, Allah is the One Who forgives and accepts repentance, Most Merciful." [49:12]

1. THE BACKBITER IS PUNISHED IN THE GRAVE

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) passed by two graves and said, "Both of them are being tortured, and they are not being tortured for a cardinal sin. But indeed they are great sins. One of them used not to save himself from being soiled with his urine,

And the other one used to go about with calumnies."227

2. ALL HIS GOOD DEEDS WILL BE TAKEN AWAY

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"Whoever has done a wrong affecting his brother's honor or something else, he must ask that one forgiveness now, before that Day comes when he will have neither Dinar nor Dirham. If he has any good deeds, then they will be deducted equal to his wrong doings; and if he has no good deeds, then the sins of the wronged will be taken and put on him."228

Of the innumerable beauties of our Deen is that it protects our honor in our absence, even in the wrong. And when a man said to Imam Hasan Al-Basri: "You have gossiped about me. He (the Imam) said: "You have not reached such a position that you can control my *Hasanat* (or good deeds)!"

3. He is Punished Severely Thereafter

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"During the Mi'raj (the Night of Ascension), I saw a group of people who were scratching their chests and faces with their copper nails. I asked, 'Who are these people, O Jibril? Jibril replied:

'These are the people who ate flesh of others (by backbiting) and trampled people's honour."229

4. AND WHAT IS BACKBITING?

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"Backbiting is talking about your (Muslim) brother in a manner which he dislikes."

They said: "What if my (Muslim) brother is as I say." He (Peace be upon him) said, "If he is actually as you say, then that is backbiting; but if that is not in him, that is slandering."230

So severe is backbiting that some of the *Tabi'een* would say: "The Sahabah considered abstaining from backbiting as a great form of worship too, just as Salah and fasting were forms of worship."

The Mu'min Stays away from Riya

1. THE SHOW OF *DEEN* IS THE WORST!

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said,

"Anyone who offers Salat (prayer) for show has undoubtedly done Shirk; and anyone who fasts for show has undoubtedly done Shirk; and anyone who gives Sadaqah (charity and alms) for show has undoubtedly done Shirk."231

The believer knows that Allah forgives every sin except Shirk and disbelief, if he passed away before repentance. Therefore, he does not intend praise or commendation of people for his Salat, or for being generous to the poor. Therefore those who have engaged in Riya or display, are required to seek forgiveness from Allah 'Azza wa Jall and refrain from doing so anymore. Surely, He is *Ghafoor* or the Forgiving One.

Imam Sufyan At-Thawri would say: "When good deeds are practised, the Angel records these in the Record of Goodness. When people speak about their good deeds, the Angel records the deeds in the Record of Riya (show and display)."And Imam Ibrahim Al-Taymi would say: "A person sincere to God hides his good deeds as much as he hides his bad deeds."

So never forget, "Indeed, actions are upon intentions." 232

The Mu'min's Sense of Fashion

1. KNOW WHOM YOU'RE COPYING

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"The one who copies any people is one of them." 233

This hadith comes as delightful news to brothers and sisters who follow the way of Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him); and at the same time, comes as warning for those who copy disbelievers and say "that style's hot". And this couldn't be more evident in matters of appearance and attitude. Thus, one could choose to copy a film celebrity and hope to be with him or her, or one could follow the Prophet (Peace be upon him), and be of those who are with him.

2. ACCURSED ARE THOSE COPYING THE OPPOSITE SEX

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) cursed men who copy women and cursed women who copy men.²³⁴

One must take a moment to reflect on how much of our behavior and appearance resembles the other sex. These

Prophetic words also bring in its fold those people who put on the attitude of the opposite sex.

And in matters of clothing, this has become all the more important when the line between the two has been blurred with accessories and labels like "unisex" and "the right fit". This is not something to be shrugged off lightly, for it invites the curse of Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him).

3. OBSCENITY

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"Indeed Allah hates the indecent and the obscene." 235

Indecency and obscenity refers to both speech and action. No one would dare to be hated by Allah 'Azza wa Jall, would they? Then why continue the obscenity in clothing?

For Men

1. WEARING A BEARD

Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) said:

"Be different from the polytheists: trim the mustache and leave the beard."236 And in the version of hadith recorded by Muslim: "...allow the beard to grow fully."

Dear brother in *Iman*, know that we are to differ from them by allowing our beards to grow. And sufficient are the Prophet's (Peace be upon him) words that:

"Whoever turns away from my Sunnah does not belong to me." 237

2. HAIRSTYLES

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) forbade shaving a part of the head. 238

Hairstyles with parts of head shaved like the Mohican, short back & sides are probably in vogue amongst our brothers. They must realize that they're giving into disobeying the Prophet (Peace be upon him) who forbade it. Thus, they should either shave their hair completely or retain them as permitted.

3. TROUSERS BELOW ANKLES

How fearsome will be the condition of the one, about whom the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) has said:

"What is below the ankles of the trousers is in the Hell-fire." 239

For Women

1. CLOTHING

When describing "People who will be punished in hell", the Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"And the women who will be dressed but appear to be naked, inclined to evil; and inclining others to it. Their heads will be like the humps of the Bactrian camel inclined to one side. They will not enter Jannah and they will not smell its fragrance."240

This hadith warns women who wear provocative clothing thereby tempting others into promiscuity. And to those sisters who remain steadfast in Deen with regards to their clothing despite such influences around them, this hadith comes as a reliever that they will not meet the fate of such women. And know my sister in *Iman*, the *Ajr* from Allah, will be massive.

2. REJECTION OF PRAYERS

The Messenger of Allah (Peace be upon him) said:

"Allah does not accept the prayers of a woman who has reached puberty unless she wears the khimar."241

Even if all the world was given to the one who was told that her prayers would not be accepted, could that make her happy in the least?

And know my Sister in Iman that modesty on your part, will only add to your beauty. 242

A Note of Encouragement to my Brothers and Sisters in Iman

The words of Imam Al-Haram, Sheikh Sa'ud Ash-Shuraim are apt in this context, who said: "The restraints imposed by our religion on people, are not meant to deprive them from the pleasures of this life - rather, its aim is to elevate them from mere animalism to complete humanity."

And, when the Prophet's Sunnah becomes dear to us, then acting upon these commandments becomes easier even at work, or between peers. And fear not the lessening of rizq, looks or position, but persevere patiently for the sake of Allah and revive these Sunan²⁴³; for You have been given the glad tidings of a great reward from Allah's Messenger (Peace be upon him) who said:

1) Successful indeed are the Believers. 2) Those who offer their Salat with all solemnity and full submissiveness. 3) And those who turn away from Al-Laghw. 4) And those who pay the Zakat. 5) And those who guard their chastity. 6) Except from their wives or that their right hands possess - for then, they are free from blame; 7) But whoever seeks beyond that, then those are the transgressors; 8) Those who are faithfully true to their Amanat (i.e. all the duties that Allah has ordained) and to their covenants; 9) And those who strictly guard their prayers. 10)

These are indeed the inheritors. 11) Who shall inherit the Firdaus (Paradise). They shall dwell therein forever.

And so moved was the Prophet (Peace be upon him) upon revelation of these initial ten verses of Surah Al-Mu'minun (23), that he turned toward the qibla, raised his hands, and supplicated fervently to Allah, the Most Merciful with these beautiful words:

"O Allah. Increase our number, and do not decrease it; bestow honor upon us and do not disgrace us; bless us with Your bounties and do not deprive us of them, accept us and do not prefer others to us; be pleased with us and please us."245

And this, My dear Brothers and Sisters in Iman, is the Minhaj-ul Mu'min or the way of the believer. It commences with the Shahadah, and upon being successful, culminates in living eternally in Al-Firdaus which is the highest of the hundred levels of Jannah over which, is the Throne.²⁴⁶

You should know - May Allah have mercy on you, that none are more fortunate than the ones who keep drawing close to Allah Subhanahu wa Ta'ala with righteous acts of worship

until He loves them.²⁴⁷ And always remember the words of the Prophet (Peace be upon him),
